As a step towards acquiring the said business of NIPL, the Company has acquired 80.07% of equity shares on September 6, 2021 of NIPL followed by consolidation of the business of NIPL with the Company pursuant to a Scheme of Merger to be approved by the NCLT such that the entire business including all the assets, liabilities and obligations of NIPL are transferred and vested in the Company, the resulting company.

The Acquisition was funded by the proceed of Rs, 190 crores through the issue of 1900 listed, secured, senior, rated, redeemable, non-convertible debentures of face value of INR 10,00,000 each for cash, at par, aggregating up to INR 190,00,000 in dematerialised form, on a private placement basis carrying coupon rate of 15.25% per annum payable quarterly.

3. The financial results for the quarter and twelve months ended March 31, 2022 have been prepared on the standalone basis.

4. The Company is continuously monitoring the situation arising on account of COVID-19 pandemic considering both internal and external factors and its production, dispatches, sales and market collections remained unaffected. The Company has made an assessment of its capital and financial resources including liquidity position and ability to service debt and other financing arrangements for next one year. The Company has also assessed the recoverability of the carrying values of its assets such as property, plant and equipment, inventory, trade receivables, investments and other current assets as at March 31, 2022. There is no impact of COVID-19 on these financial results.
